PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

"It feels unfinished," quipped a seven-year-old in response to the premiere of the first play I wrote in 2019. Those three words have stuck with me throughout the pandemic, and throughout this entire season of STAR.

I began writing this adaptation directly from Agatha Christie's novel on June 1st of this year, just a little over two months before opening night. I didn't have anything I could copy and paste from the internet, I was going totally oldschool --- highlighting and bookmarking sections in the book I later transcribed into script-form. Luckily, The Murder of Roger Ackroyd is an incredibly dialogue-heavy story with about ten percent of the prose devoted to narration and description. It's meant to be a play.

Why this particular work by Agatha Christie? What sets *The Murder of Roger Ackroyd* apart from other Christie mysteries is the character of the killer. Obviously, I don't want to spoil anything yet, but their involvement in the investigation of the murder is unprecedented. When I first read the book, I knew that it was them, but their participation made me question if it actually was them. I even began to suspect some of the other characters. *The Murder of Roger Ackroyd* is definitely *the* most underrated Agatha Chrisitie murder mystery for its dizzying twists and intricate character work.

When I completed the first draft of this adaptation, I knew for a fact that it was unfinished. I knew that there were going to be changes as soon as I started to see it be rehearsed by

living, breathing people. I felt terrible for making revisions to the script during the rehearsal process, but it wasn't my decision to make. Now that I adapted a novel into a script, I had to adapt this script to its players. The play you'll see tonight is the result of collaboration between artists of all ages and experiences. And it's still a work-in-progress. But I am proud to say that it is!

I am proud of everyone involved, especially the young actors. They did what many professional adult actors consider a great challenge, which is breathing life into a piece that has never been performed yet. And on top of that, they did it in three weeks. I am so grateful for their dedication and their willingness to work with the hurdles that come with producing a world premiere. I loved watching them rehearse and practice with their new friends. They asked me and the other members of the production team the most thoughtful questions, some of them I had never even thought of. They helped me develop not only this piece, but also the way I think about this piece.

And with that, thank you, dear audience member, for coming to see this play.
